WEF 2026 - Traffic orders

1 The Cantonal Police, Grisons and the Municipality of Davos issue the following, temporary traffic orders on the occasion of the WEF 2026 pursuant to Art. 3, para. 6 Swiss Road Act (SVG; SR 741.01):

The following traffic orders apply to increase safety for the entire road system within Davos: They can be issued or rescinded based on the current situation in the period from Monday, January 5, 2026, through Saturday, January 31, 2026, to the extent that individual traffic orders identify another time period.

2 Promenade

2.1 Closure of partial route at the Scaletta Street intersection to the English Church:

Starting Saturday, January 17, 2026 / 3 pm through Saturday, January 24, 2026 / 6 pm, the Promenade will be closed from the turn off Promenade / Scalletta Street (Hotel Rinaldi) to the English Church and traffic will be diverted via the Scaletta street. Approved travel is excluded from this measure (VBD until Saturday, January 17, 2026 / 10 pm and as of Saturday, January 24, 2026 / 5:30 am). Travel with permits is permitted between the Scalettastrasse intersection and the Hertistrasse.

2.2 On-coming traffic on the Promenade; Seehof to Scalettastrasse:

As of Saturday, January 17, 2026 / 10 am through Friday, January 23, 2026 / 6 pm, the Promenade is open to on-coming traffic on the section between Seehof up to intersection at the Scaletta street.

2.3 Scaletta parking log

Starting Sunday, January 18, 2026 / 5 pm, to Saturday, January 24, 2026 / 8 am, part of the parking lot at Scaletta next to the access to Hotel Ameron is closed and reserved for the use of the police.

2.4 Symond parking lot

Starting Sunday, January 18, 2026 / 5 pm through Saturday, January 24, 2026 / 6 pm, a section of the parking lot at Symond is closed to the public and made available as required to the police.

2.5 Horlauben parking lot

Starting Monday, January 5, 2026 / 7 am through Monday, January 26, 2026 / 6 pm, the Horlauben parking lot is closed to the public and available as required to the police.

2.6 Library parking lot

Starting Friday, January 16, 2026 / 6 pm through Monday, January 26, 2026 / 6 pm, the parking lot at Promenade 88, Schweizerhaus (the former library), is closed to the public and made available as required to the police.

2.7 Kirchner Museum park

Starting Monday, January 5, 2026 / 7 am through Saturday, January 31, 2026 / 6 pm, the Park at the Kirchner Museum is closed to the public and available as a waiting area for authorized vehicles and available as required to the police. Parking vehicles during the build-up and tear-down phases requires a permit from the municipality.

2.8 Separation of the sidewalk along the Promenade

Starting Sunday, January 18, 2026 / 8 am through Saturday, January 24, 2026 / 6 pm, the Promenade is closed to pedestrian traffic between the Kongress Hotel and the intersection at Scaletta Street at the English Church. Personnel accredited by WEF are excluded by these measures.

3 Talstrasse

3.1 Two-way traffic along the Talstrasse

Starting January 5, 2026 / 2 pm through Friday, January 30, 2026 / 6 pm, the Tal Street will be open to two-way traffic between the Davos Platz train station and the Montana intersection.

3.2 Closure of Congress Center parking lot

Starting Sunday, January 11, 2026 / 7 am through Monday, January 26, 2026 / 6 pm, the Congress Center parking lot is closed for security reasons and available as required for the police.

3.3 Closure of Metz parking lot

Starting Monday, January 5, 2026 / 7 am through Friday, February 13, 2026 / 6 pm, the Metz parking lot is closed to the public and available as required to the police and WEF. Part of the parking lot is opened for the four HCD home matches on Friday, January 9, Tuesday, January 27, Friday, January 30 as well as Sunday, February 1, 2026.

3.4 Closure of Sports Center (Sportzentrum) parking lot

Starting Friday, January 16, 2026 / 7 am through Saturday, January 24, 2026 / 6 pm, the entire Sports center parking lot is closed to the public and available as required to the police and WEF. A limited number of parking spaces are available to visitors to the sports center as an alternative to the Metz parking lot.

3.5 No turn at intersection Talstrasse / Hertistrasse:

No left turns permitted as of Sunday, January 18, 2026 / 2 pm through Friday, January 23, 2026 / 6 pm on the Talstrasse in the direction of Hertistrasse (Congress side). Only right turns permitted from Herti Street (Kongress side) into the Tal Street.

3.6 Closure Hertistrasse

Starting Sunday, January 18, 2026 / 6 pm through Friday, January 23, 2026 / 6 pm, the Hertistrasse will be closed to pedestrians and vehicles between the Promenade and Talstrasse. Personnel and vehicles accredited by WEF and residents are excluded by these measures.

3.7 Closure Richtstattweg

Starting Saturday, January 17, 2026 / 3 pm through Friday, January 23, 2026 / 6 pm, the Richtstattweg will be closed between the Promenade and Scalettastrasse. People residing here and police vehicles are exempted from this measure.

3.8 Closure of Panorama parking lot at the ice stadium

Starting on Monday, January 5, 2026 / 7 am through Thursday, January 29, 2026 / 12 pm, the entire Panorama parking lot is closed to the public and available as required to the police and WEF. Part of the parking lot will be open during the HCD home games on Friday, January 9 and Tuesday, January 27, 2026.

3.9 Closure of pedestrian paths in the Kurpark

Starting Sunday, January 18, 2026 / 7 am through Monday, January 26, 2026 / 6 pm, the pedestrian paths in the Kurpark (Carl-Dorno path and Jules-Federmann path), between the Congress Center and the Ice stadium, as well as the access to the swimming pool are closed.

3.10 Partial closure Reginaweg / Alteinstrasse

Starting Saturday, January 17, 2026 / 2 pm through Friday, January 23, 2026 / 6 pm, access to Reginaweg is only possible via the Talstrasse. Access from and to the Promenade is blocked.

3.11 Closure Symondsstrasse

Starting Saturday, January 17, 2026 / 2 pm through Friday, January 23, 2026 / 6 pm, the Symondstrasse will be closed between the Promenade and Richtstattweg.

3.12 Closure Obere Strasse

Between Sunday, January 18, 2026 / 5 pm and Friday, January 23, 2026 / 6 pm, the Obere Strasse will be closed in the area around the Hotel Steigenberger Belvédère. VBD Davos and emergency responders are exempted from this measure.

3.13 Delays and temporary closure Flüelastrasse

Starting Saturday, January 17, 2026 / 8 am through Friday, January 23, 2026 / 6 pm, expect delays on the Flüelastrasse between the intersection at Bahnhofstrasse Sagenstutz (above Fährich) as well as temporary closures. A section of this route is used as a waiting area and traffic may be detoured with traffic signs.

3.14 Closure Lake parking lot / Lake promenade

Starting Monday, January 5, 2026 / 7 am through Thursday, January 29, 2026 / 6 pm, the entire lake parking lot is closed to the public and available as required to the police. During this period, the lake path between the parking lot at the Davos lake and the beach is closed to the public and unavailable for pedestrians and vehicles.

The path around the Davos lake remains open to pedestrians via the Seewiesenstrasse, via the Flüelastrasse / SLF or via the Flüela- / Stillistrasse. Signs mark the detour of the path around the lake.

4 Special order for public transportation

Between Sunday, January 18 and Friday, January 23, 2026, buses will be operating under a special WEF schedule (changed VBD lines and times). Individual bus stops will be moved or closed starting Monday, January 12 through Monday, January 26, 2026. More detailed information to be published in January in the Davoser Zeitung, on vbd.ch, in the SBB online schedule, and directly in buses and at bus stops.

Public transportation may be closed in part or completely for any traffic disturbances, demonstrations, etc.

5 Limited parking and places to stop

5.1 Parking and stopping during the set up and taking down of the facilities along the indicated sections of road requires a permit by the municipality for the assigned locations.

Submit any applications to the Davos Office of Public Safety (081 414 30 30) as early as possible.

Vehicles not permitted or that hinder traffic as well as any vehicles that cannot be identified, are removed at the expense of the impacted party. The legal owner can retrieve towed vehicles against payment for costs (transportation and parking) at the Cantonal Police Grisons.

6 General Instructions

6.1 Provisional traffic recommendation

You should anticipate traffic jams along the Talstrasse between the cutoff Albana and the Hertistrasse. For this reason, we recommend using the marked detour via the Matta and Dischmastrasse when driving from Davos Platz to Davos Dorf.

6.2 Traffic delays

In advance of and during the WEF 2026, expect traffic delays, changed routes as well as short-term closures throughout the entire Davos road network, especially in the event of any disruptions in traffic resulting, for example, from a demonstration.
